Joint Personnel and Water & Sewer– March 9, 2023:

- Approved amending the Public Works Director position ad as discussed and publish as soon as possible with an application deadline of April 28, 2023.
- Discussed sewer and water line replacement in alley between S. Ellis Ave. and S. Emery Ave.
- Recommended the Finance Committee review budgeting of changing the part-time Deputy Clerk-Treasurer position to a full-time position.
- Entered closed session to discuss WPPA/Leer Peshtigo Police Labor Agreement.

RLF/UDAG – March 14 & 29, 2023:

- Recommended Council approve a UDAG renewal loan to Precision Ice Blast, Corporation in the amount of \$147,765.43 with interest at 125 basis points above the ten-year treasury yield as of five business days prior to closing for a six and a half-year term, contingent upon a second position and all collateral and guarantees will remain in place and upon satisfaction of all other loan requirements and procedures.
- Recommended Council approve designating an additional \$25,000 from RLF Funds for the Façade Improvement Grant Program with the program closing at the end of 2023.
- Approved a Facade Grant to Precision Iceblast, Corporation at 801 Maple St. for up to \$10,000 contingent of city funding and providing contractor estimates for eligible expenses.
